

# If You Didn't Learn It, You Didn't Earn It.

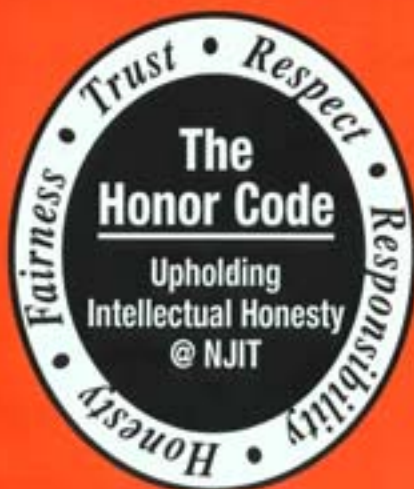
When you steal an exam, get answers to questions during the test or falsify lab results, you get a grade based on work you didn't do, and a degree you didn't earn.

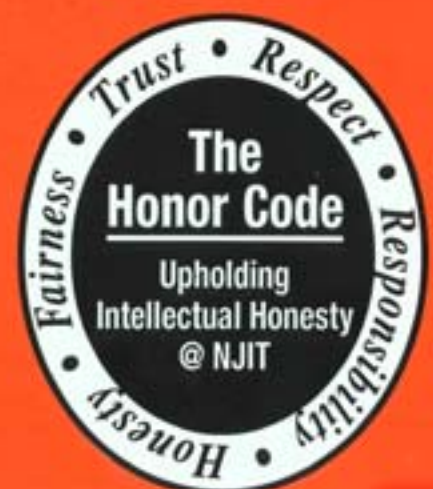
## NJIT Academic Honor Code CHEATING

*Definition: "Deceiving or attempting to deceive by misrepresenting that one has learned information pertinent to an academic exercise."*

*Examples: Using notes prohibited from exam site; programming a calculator to show formulas/information not available during exam; using test answers provided by another; giving or receiving unfair aid; resubmitting altered work for additional credit; permitting another to copy work during an exam.*
