## NJIT Academic Honor Code PLAGIARISM

*Definition: "Using or attempting to use written, oral or graphic work which was authored or prepared by another and submitting it as one's own."*

*Examples: Submitting a paper copied from a friend's work; purchasing a paper from a term-paper writing company or downloading a paper from the Internet; quoting words or paraphrasing ideas without properly footnoting and referencing the source; modifying a paper written by someone else; handing in homework copied from someone else's work.*
